Rules, Rewards, and Consequences

Key Question: How do the rules, rewards, and consequences contribute to establishing a positive community of learners?

Directions: Ask your mentor to share the ways rules are created in this school and the types of rules she has in her classroom. Novice teachers who have difficulty managing a classroom often tend to create harsh rules like "no talking!" or "no getting out of your seat," and these no rules are problematic for many students who have difficulty if their preferred style of learning is more social. How will you create appropriate rules? Reflect and respond to these questions. E-mail your responses to your mentor and discuss them at your next meeting. Bring a copy of your rules, a sample of rewards, and what consequences you are using.
