- 1. Start with a simple truism at the top.
- 2. In the green (left) heart, write a title of a book or movie you love.
- 3. Next to the heart, explain how that title illustrates your truism.
- 4. In the green (left) box, write a heart truism, telling a specific truism that relates to that character's situation.
- 5. Switch sides.
- 6. In the pink (right) heart, write the title of another book or movie you love.
- 7. Next to that heart, explain how that title illustrates your truism.
- 8. In the pink (right) box, write a heart truism, telling a specific truism that relates to this character's situation.
- 9. For the conclusion, add together the simple truism on top and phrases from your heart truisms.


Green (left) heart: Forrest Gump.


Pink (right) heart: Beauty and the Beast.
