

Creating Commitment and Taking Action

What It Is

- Create a commitment to productive action.
- Promote collaborative accountability to ensure a commitment to productive action.
- Be aware of how perceptions of risk can hamper deliberate action.
- Ensure that leaders and teachers have the will as well as the necessary skills and knowledge to take action.

Why It Matters

- Commitment and action are essential for change, without which there will be limited impact on student outcomes.
- Underlying all DAFs is the necessity to create commitment and take action.
- Creating commitment and taking action are central to a social justice agenda.
- A culture of collaborative accountability is necessary to ensure improvement occurs and is sustained.

How I Do It

- ▶ Commit to both notice and take action.
- Make sure there is a shared understanding of why actions are being taken.

- Co-construct commitment to action by being clear about next steps.
- Take a strengths-based approach to engaging others in taking action.
- Check on and hold people accountable for agreed actions.
- Pay attention to those who aren't on board.
- Acknowledge uncertainty, and help people manage it.

Key Challenges for Me

- Getting people started
- ▶ Engaging the reluctant
- Ensuring agreed actions are undertaken through systems of collaborative accountability
- ▶ Taking action when not everyone is on board

What I Should Notice

- ▶ Who is and isn't on board?
- Is there a shared understanding of what actions will be taken and why?
- Are people clear about the next steps for which they are responsible, and are they the right actions?
- Is there a culture of accountability for agreed actions?
