

Some of Our Favorite Resources and Tips for Selecting Your Own

Selecting resources for English language arts can make or break your day! You are in a powerful position as a teacher. Select resources that are engaging and allow you to share your love of reading and writing with students. Here are some things we look for when selecting texts:

WHOLE-GROUP READING

- **What to Look For**
 - Fun, diverse characters that students can connect with
 - Unique writing styles that draw the reader in
 - Creative illustrations that grab students' attention before reading
 - A story line or organizational structure that facilitates the reading comprehension goal
 - **Red Flags**
 - Overwhelming length or amount of text
 - Small font and few pictures
 - Content that you are unable to "sell" to students
 - A topic that students have very little understanding of (no background knowledge)
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INDEPENDENT READING

- **What to Look For**
 - High-interest content (students can often read above their reading levels when they are motivated by a particular text)
 - Well-written style
 - Variety of supports for students (decodable words, pictures that support the meaning, appropriate font size)
 - A balance of fiction and nonfiction
 - Familiar characters
 - **Red Flags**
 - Decodable texts that are not easy to comprehend
 - Outdated books ("hand-me-downs" that no longer match student interests)
 - Books that are too hard or too easy for individual students
 - Books that are the appropriate reading level, but do not engage an individual child
