# **Bringing a Systemic Focus**

### What It Is

- See any improvement effort as part of a number of larger contexts, which will affect how proposed changes are taken up (e.g., classroom, department, school, district, family, community).
- Help other people see all the "moving parts" that are involved in making improvements.
- Value and prioritize coherence within and across different parts of the organization.
- Be a coordinator and a link between levels and contexts.
- Explicitly develop shared understandings across levels and contexts.
- Focus efforts and resources on common goals.

#### Why It Matters

- Students, classrooms, and schools sit inside wider systems that shape what can be done.
- Isolated pockets of improvement will not lead to sustained improvement for learners, but coherence across systems can.
- Deliberately working across multiple levels triggers quicker and more lasting impacts.
- Engaging people across the system leads to better decisions and more sustainable improvement.
- Understanding how different layers influence what happens makes problem solving more effective.

#### How I Do It

- Build relationships with key players across the system, and gain their commitment.
- Keep the big picture in mind, and help others to do this too.

- Understand improvement in its context, seeing what surrounds the chosen focus and why things are as they are.
- Manage complexity, and understand how things are interconnected.
- Work in and across multilevel teams.
- Co-construct a shared vision or purpose, and keep actions across contexts and levels directed toward this.
- Implement specific actions as part of a wider context and broader plan.

## Key Challenges for Me

- Preventing overload, fragmentation, and "initiativitis"
- Keeping the big picture in mind while also attending to details at a local level
- Creating coherence across systems when there are many people involved with different perceptions, commitments, and beliefs
- Gaining access to all levels of a context

#### What I Should Notice

- Who are the key players I need to engage with?
- Who is missing, and how am I including them?
- Where is there connection or disconnection with me?
- How am I making others aware of the importance of a systemic approach?
- How am I taking account of systemic factors in my understanding of a context or issue?
- Am I thinking widely when asking why things are as they are?

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
