1. Record all individual reviewer scores for a given piece of student work. (A, B, C, etc., are for each rubric criterion).
2. Indicate X where all reviewers at the table had consensus on the assigned scores.
3. Decide if the work should be used for training or as an anchor paper. (Anchor papers can be scored by multiple scorers with high level of exact agreement, or can be useful for training if there are unique features.)
