




Earth, Wind, and Fire

Touchdown, Fumble, Pass

Touchdown	What was your big score for the day?
Fumble	What did you not get today? What part needs clarification? Where did your understanding drop off?
Pass	What part of the lesson would you pass on?

ACDC

A (ASK)	Ask me one question about today's material.
C (CONNECT)	Connect today's lesson to another concept.
D (DRAW)	Draw an image/picture that goes with the lesson.
C (CUES)	What cues can help you remember today's material?

H	Hints
A	Ask a question
D	Draw a picture or Define a concept
