



# Choices for Elaborating in Informational Writing

When the writer wants to ... 	Your feedback might include ... 
Explain a fact or collection of facts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Adding your thoughts about those facts</li> <li>Comparing those facts to something else ("a dolphin pod is like a family")</li> <li>Quoting directly from a source that explains the fact</li> <li>Rephrasing the fact to clarify ("In other words . . .")</li> <li>Adding a graphic that illustrates the fact(s), like a photo, diagram, chart, etc.</li> <li>Using an anecdote about that fact</li> </ul>
Define content-specific words	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Adding a definition inside parentheses</li> <li>Adding a definition inside commas, as an appositive</li> <li>Writing the definition in the next sentence</li> <li>Adding a graphic that illustrates and clarifies the definition</li> <li>Adding a textbox or sidebar with the definition</li> <li>Defining the words in a glossary</li> </ul>
Create cohesion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Using transition words from paragraph to paragraph and sometimes sentence to sentence</li> <li>Designing subheadings that have similar patterns or wording</li> <li>In paragraphs, having your opening sentence and closing sentence say similar things</li> <li>Ensuring that all writing under a heading belongs there</li> </ul>
