Subject/verb agreement

We was going.

It don't matter.

One (of my brothers) are here.

The **boys** (with the band) **is** talented.

<u>Measles</u> are a dangerous disease. There <u>is</u> some <u>problems</u> in these sentences.

They is all the same problem.

Proof:

(plural) (singular)
<u>We was</u> going

(plural)(plural)
We were going.
