I before E (except after C—or pronounced like an A, as in neighbor and weigh)

thief, chief, belief, relief, piece
After C: receive, perceive,
conceive

Like A: neighbor, weigh

EX:

(i before e) (i before e)
The police chief began to piece
together the clues left by the
(i before e)
thieves.
