
Verbs

PRACTICE THE CONVERSATION:

- A: No, I'm afraid not.
- **B:** I think it is.
- A: Can you prove it?
- B: I swims, you swims, he swims?
- A: It sounds weird in the first two, doesn't it? But in the third one, it works. So you're right! *Swims* is definitely a verb.
