runs how? ____ runs where? ____ runs when? ____

Ex:

(runs when? always) Míchael <u>sometímes</u> speaks (runs how? clearly) <u>harshly</u> to hís fríends.

PRACTICE THE CONVERSATION:

- **A:** Will you please read the sentence?
- **B:** Michael sometimes speaks harshly.
- **A:** There are two adverbs labeled here. What's the first one?
- **B:** Sometimes.
- A: That's not an adverb.
- **B:** I think it is.
- A: Can you prove it?
- B: Runs when? Sometimes.
- A: Oh! It is an adverb!
- **B:** And there's another one. Harshly.
- A: Can you prove that's an adverb?
- **B:** Runs how? Harshly.
- A: Great job! How about *to his friends*? That tells where. Runs where? *To his friends*. Isn't it an adverb?
- **B:** No. *To his friends* is three words. Adverb proofs can have only **one word.**
- A: Excellent!



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
