Tips for Parent Book Clubs

- Consider picking a book that is available in multiple languages and as an audiobook to increase accessibility.
- Try to use a book that comes with a facilitation guide. This will save you time by having prescripted questions and areas of focus.
- Pick a book you have read. Just because a book is newly popular doesn't mean it aligns to your school's shared vision. Read the book to anticipate areas where parents might struggle or to find specific sections that align nicely to your school's work.
- Do you have another event happening before the book club? Hand out flyers at that event to drum up interest.
