Number of Students	Example Activities
Pairs	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Two students work together to code an app.• Two students design and carry out an experiment in science.• Two students discuss the learning objectives for the day.• Two students pause after each paragraph to summarize the idea.
Triads	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students work together using the design cycle to create a device that protects an egg when dropped from the third floor.• Students research a different aspect of a country and combine the ideas into a presentation.• Students analyze different characters in a novel and collaborate to show how each character impacted the others.
Small Group (Four Students)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students work together to write a script for characters in their five-minute play for drama.• Students compose a song for music.• Students design and install a new mural for the school.• Students develop and implement a program to meet a community need
