## 19 CONSIDERATIONS FOR SUCCESSFUL ONE-PAGERS

- Choose elements you want students to put onto their one-pagers: for example, quotations, key themes, literary elements, discussion of style, important characters or dates, connections to other disciplines, connections to their lives, connections to modern culture.
- 2. Create a layout using the shapes tool in PowerPoint or something similar.
- Connect your instructions to your layout. Make it clear which elements should go in which area of your template (this is especially important in younger grades).
- 4. Rubrics created for these assignments should draw directly from success criteria and should be discussed prior to giving this assessment.
- Digital one-pagers can be created using a variety of programs (depending on the level of comfort students and teachers have), but are just as effective if built in a word processing program.
- One-pagers should be displayed for all students to participate in a Virtual Gallery walk. This is especially true if the one-pager is being used for a larger summary (unit, film, etc.).
