

## Alternative Launch Activity for Lesson 2

### Launch (15 minutes)

- Begin by sharing information about the creation of the internet to provide a foundation for the exploration. Here are some possibilities:

- Next display the “Most Common Languages Used on the Internet” data (slide 19) from Tableau Public and ask students the following questions:
  - *What do you notice?*
  - *What do you wonder?*
  - *How does it make you feel?*
  - *What is the story being told here?*
- Allow students 3 minutes to record their observations, feelings, and questions independently before sharing as a whole class/group.
- Discuss the following:
  - *In what ways do the genesis of the internet and its ongoing development help explain the data represented?*
  - *Deep Mathematical Questions: How can data representation tell a compelling and powerful story?*
  - *Social Justice-Related Questions: How can data representations help us reveal, understand, and act upon bias and social inequities?*
