Alternative Launch Activity for Lesson 2

Launch (15 minutes)

- Begin by sharing information about the creation of the internet to provide a foundation for the exploration. Here are some possibilities:

- Next display the "Most Common Languages Used on the Internet" data (slide 19) from Tableau Public and ask students the following questions:
 - What do you notice?
 - What do you wonder?
 - How does it make you feel?
 - What is the story being told here?
- Allow students 3 minutes to record their observations, feelings, and questions independently before sharing as a whole class/group.
- Discuss the following:
 - In what ways do the genesis of the internet and its ongoing development help explain the data represented?
 - Deep Mathematical Questions: How can data representation tell a compelling and powerful story?
 - Social Justice-Related Questions: How can data representations help us reveal, understand, and act upon bias and social inequities?
