

Narrative Continuation – Self-Assessment and Reflection

<p>TITLE – What did you decide to title your narrative?</p>	
<p>CHARACTERS – Who are the central characters in your story? Does the reader get a strong sense of who they are? (Thoughts, appearance, motivation, etc.)</p>	
<p>SETTING (Time) – When does your story take place?</p>	
<p>SETTING (Place) – Where does your story place? Do you include imagery to help the reader visualize the setting?</p>	
<p>CONFLICT(S) – What is the core/driving conflict in your story?</p>	
<p>POINT OF VIEW – What point of view is your narrative written from?</p>	
<p>VERB TENSE – What verb tense did you write in? Does it stay consistent throughout?</p>	
<p>tone – How would you describe the overall tone of your continuation?</p>	
<p>PLOT – How does your story begin? How do you draw readers in?</p>	
<p>PLOT – What is the tension/suspense in the rising action? What is the story building towards?</p>	

<p>PLOT – What is the climax or big moment in your story?</p>	
<p>PLOT – How does your narrative conclude? How do you want the reader to feel at the end of the story?</p>	
<p>THEMES – What theme(s) does your story explore? What is the big idea or message your story is trying to convey?</p>	
<p>DIALOGUE – Does your narrative include realistic dialogue? Does it reveal character and/or advance the plot? Is it formatted correctly?</p>	
<p>MONOLOGUE – Who delivers the monologue in your narrative? What purpose does it serve in the story?</p>	
<p>ALLUSION – What allusion did you include in your narrative?</p>	
<p>NARRATIVE TECHNIQUE – What narrative techniques did you include? (Flashback, foreshadowing, symbolism, figurative language, etc.) Share an example and name the technique here.</p>	
<p>What are two things you are most proud of in your narrative?</p>	
<p>What is one area you'd like to improve or work on in the future?</p>
