in your narrative? What purpose does it serve in	
the story?	
ALLUSION – What allusion did you include in	
your narrative?	
NARRATIVE TECHNIQUE – What narrative	
techniques did you include? (Flashback,	
foreshadowing, symbolism, figurative language,	
etc.) Share an example and name the technique	
here.
