5. There are consistent challenging learning expectations for all multilingual learners regardless of their backgrounds and education status, as is apparent in assessment.		
6. Assessment captures the depth and breadth of a rich culminating experience (i.e., performance, project, or product).		
7. The synthesizing summative assessment experience at the close of a unit represents the learning targets along with evidence.		
8. Assessment offers student voice to be heard in multiple languages.		

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
