5. Students have opportunities to offer focused feedback to each other.		
6. Students pair rubric descriptors with their evidence for learning.		
7. Students can restate criteria and give an example in the language of their choice.		
8. Students make judgments about the quality of their work according to the rubric's criteria.		
9. Students revise their work based on targeted feedback.		
10. Students negotiate with teachers to determine the extent to which they have met the rubric's criteria.		

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
