<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Fostering independence and individual achievement</li><li>• Promoting self-expression, individual thinking, and personal choice</li><li>• Associated with egalitarian relationships and flexibility in roles (e.g., upward mobility)</li><li>• Understanding the physical world as knowable apart from its meaning for human life</li><li>• Associated with private property and individual ownership</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Fostering interdependence and group success</li><li>• Promoting adherence to norms, respect for authority/elders, and group consensus</li><li>• Associated with stable, hierarchical roles (dependent on gender, family background, and age)</li><li>• Understanding the physical world in the context of its meaning for human life</li><li>• Associated with shared property and group ownership</li></ul>
